Milka Clarke Stroke Brain Trauma Foundation Academic Scholarship Award

Milka Clarke Stroke Brain Trauma Foundation recognizes that the academic journey to self-actualization, is not easy, but if you have been striving in your academic pursuit, scoring at least a 'B' Average in your grades, possess some basic leadership qualities, provide service to your community, and have the desire to pursue higher education, then you may be eligible to receive a scholarship award.

Scholarships are awarded to outstanding youths who are students of excellence with verifiable financial hardship. You may be high school seniors planning to pursue post-secondary education at technical schools, as well as at two year colleges and four year universities. Qualified applicants are eligible to receive a one-time award.

Who is eligible to apply for the scholarship?

Eligible applicants are Students of Excellence from grades 8-12 at Green Island High School; students with a known financial hardship, have been actively involved in student government, community outreach, or other youth department activities.

Applicants must submit all required documentations, application, typed essay, and signed forms verifying participation in community organizations.

Applicants must place all application materials in a sealed envelope, along with one copy of a current half picture. All required documents must be placed in the receipt of the GIHS Scholarship Liaison by **Midnight, May 9th of the high school graduation year.**

At this time the application process is not automated nor done exclusively online. In the future we hope to have online application automation.

How to Apply

Applicants must submit a completed scholarship application and supporting documentations by the stated deadline. Late or incomplete applications will not be considered! **NO EXCEPTIONS!**

<u>APPLICATION DEADLINE:</u> All applications and essays must be submitted to the GIHS Scholarship Administration/Liaison no later than the (second) 2nd Friday in May of each year.

• **AWARD PRESENTED:** The winning recipients will receive their scholarship awards at the Annual Welcome Service at GIHS.

A complete application packet must include the following:

- Your short Bio in less than 200 words. Your Bio will be used to introduce you at the awards ceremony.
- The scholarship application with all sections completed.
- A photograph with your name and high school listed on the back.
- A copy of at least one letter of recommendation from a community organization that you are a member of. A letter of recommendation must be submitted that documents the applicant's level of participation and involvement in school or community activities.

The letter must be written by a community leader, teacher, or supervisor of any auxiliary in which the applicant is active.

The scholarship will not be based on the essay, as the essay is **only a part of** the application that will allow GIHS scholarship administration, to verify academic excellence based on GIHS academic grading system, as well as all other scholarship criteria.

If a student <u>did not apply</u> with an essay, he/she <u>CANNOT</u> be considered for a scholarship, even if they have met the excellence standard. After 2015, No exceptions will be allowed. Everyone has to apply to be considered.

All essays must be:

- Typed and submitted with the application.
- Please record your name on the essay and attach it to this application.
- The top four recipients will be selected for the Milka Clarke Stroke Brain Trauma Foundation Scholarship Award.
- The recipients will receive their awards at the Annual Welcome Service at GIHS.
- Essays will be evaluated according to these categories: grammar usage and mechanics, clarity and coherence, adherence to theme and inclusion of adequate details.

Letter of Recommendation

Please submit letter(s) of recommendation from any school official, clergy, prominent business owner or leader in a community group or church in which you are active, documenting your level of participation and involvement in community activities.

The Letter of Recommendation can come from your Homeroom Teacher.
